
Life just got a little better for our clients. We have increased our nightly capacity by 20 beds! We are slowly building our way back from the huge loss of beds during Covid.

The increase happened last month, and our clients are very happy. 20 fewer folks will walk off into the night, because now they have a place to go. The new beds are available for earlier check-in (more sleep!), access to showers nightly, as well as a hot breakfast each morning.

It might seem like a small thing, but a meal and a night of safe rest is a game-changer to someone without a home. Your support makes it possible for us to pay for these beds, enabling folks to stabilize and get their lives back on track.

This is care in the moment. A safety net. This is Nightwatch. We are honored to help folks find shelter, if only for the night. We are thankful for you, and the shelters and churches who open their doors and hearts.

We go to the same places every week, hoping to meet the same people – to try and develop relationships with them.


So, it's always kind of funny when we find someone we know, but not in the same neighborhood we normally see them.
